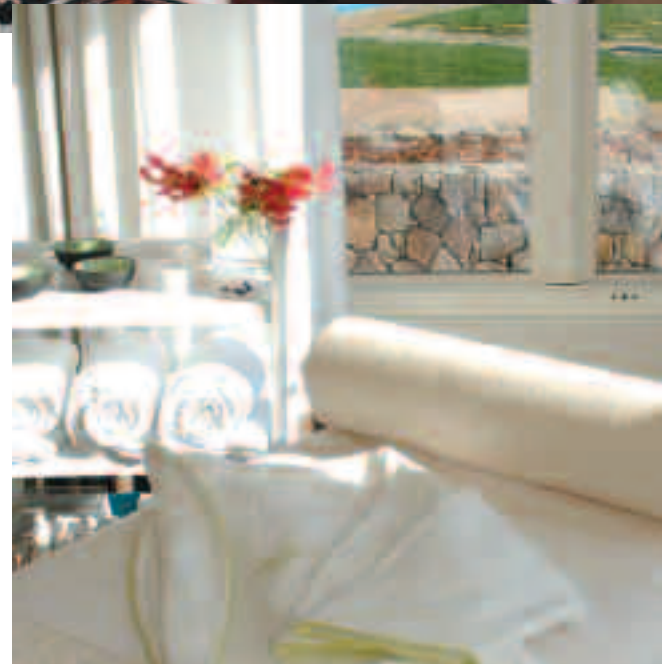

Where to stay

Nearly eight years in the making, the 27-acre Carneros Inn is called a “township” by its creators and includes a resort-style hotel and spa as well as private homes. Set in the rolling hills and vineyards of the valley’s Carneros wine-growing region, horses graze close to manicured hedges, vineyards, apple orchards and beds of lavender. Guests are pampered in the country setting, where they can roam from the single-story guest cottages to the restaurant, bar, swimming pool and spa. But don’t let the board-and-batten sides, multi-paned windows, tin roofs and barn-like structures of this sprawling resort fool you – it’s state-of-the-art and designed by Boston architect William Rawn. The guest bungalows feature spacious bathrooms with elegant Waterworks features, flat-screen televisions, modernist furniture and private fenced courtyards. Prices range from \$375 to \$600 per night for the cottages and from \$850 to \$1,200 per night for suites.
